Tree Varieties and Information

Cherokee Brave Dogwood

(*Cornus florida* 'Comco No. 1)

Size: 25' H x 30' W

Soil: Well drained

Light: Pt shade/ full sun.

Spring bloom and maroon fall color and vibrant red berries.

Food source for birds. Pest and disease resistant. Drought tolerant.

Japanese Tree Lilac

(*Syringa reticulata*)

Size: 25' H x 20' W

Soil: Well drained

Light: Full sun to part shade

Large clusters of white flowers in June. Tolerant of salt and drought.

Attracts pollinators. Interesting bark.

Ohio Buckeye

(*Aesculus glabra*)

Size: 50' H x 45' W

Soil: Well-drained, acidic

Light: Full sun

Neatly rounded shape. Leaves out early. White bloom panicles.

Interesting inedible nuts. Orange-yellow fall color.

Northern Pin Oak

(*Quercus ellipsoidalis*)

Size: 60' H x 50' W

Soil: Dry to medium.

Light: Full sun

Medium sized oak with glossy leaves. Russet-red in fall. Acorns liked by deer, squirrels, and some birds. Prefers acidic, sandy soil. Tolerates moderate flooding.

Tuliptree

(*Liriodendron tulipifera*)

Size: 80' H x 40' W

Soil: Adaptable

Light: Mostly sun.

Large, fast-growing native. Interesting leaves and tulip shaped yellow-green flowers. Bright golden-yellow fall color.

Norway Spruce

(*Picea abies*)

Size: 50' H x 25' W

Soil: Adaptable

Light: Full sun

Great as specimen or windbreak. Fast growing and strong.
