For decades, MPW has provided reliable energy to power our community's growth and prosperity. We are as committed today as we were nearly 100 years ago to meeting the needs and expectations of our customers.

"MPW's goals are to reduce carbon emissions associated with local electric generation by at least 25% by 2024 and 65% by 2030 through the expansion of renewable energy sources and the transition from coal to natural gas generation."

Our record of dedicated service extends beyond providing essential services. It is also reflected in the responsible and respectful treatment of our local natural resources. As we look to our future, MPW's promise to customers continues to be **reliable**, **cost-effective** and **environmentally responsible** services for the direct benefit of our community.

Our new "Power the Future" Strategy is shown below. MPW is actively developing an RFP to add 30 megawatts of solar capacity in Muscatine, engaging with Stanley Consultants in the evaluation and economics of a new gas-fired CHP resource, and planning the retirement of Units 7, 8 and 8A (Plant 1) in 2023. The addition of renewable and gas-fired generating resources would allow us to reliably meet local energy needs, plan for the retirement of our remaining coal-fired generating unit (Unit 9) by the end of the decade, and meet our bold carbon emission reduction goals (top-right).

Know what's below and keep an eye out for wires on the surface

Keep everyone connected

As you begin lawn mowing and other yard work this year, please do your part to help avoid fiber, power, water and gas line cuts.

1. **Call before you dig!** Call 811 or visit www.iowaonecall.com. A damaged utility or fiber line will impact your service and possibly your neighbors' services.

2. **Look before you mow!** If you see there

is a fiber line lying on the surface in your yard, please coil the line up and out of the way of lawnmowers and weed eaters.

FTTH Crews will sweep the entire community this year removing old Legacy equipment from the field and correcting field conditions, such as open pedestals or fiber lines that need tucked safely away.

So, **Call Before You Dig** and **Look Before You Mow**. A little extra precaution can save you and your neighbors an avoidable loss of service. Thank you.



MPW's flushing procedure is a comprehensive maintenance activity that helps keep the water mains clean and provides valuable feedback on the condition of each fire hydrant connected to the MPW water distribution system. When MPW flushes hydrants in the spring and fall, customers can use our new interactive map to watch our progress and know when we'll be flushing in your area.

Water is not unsafe to use but you'll need to flush your taps by running cold water for several minutes until they're clear prior to drinking.

PLEASE REFRAIN FROM DOING LAUNDRY WHEN WATER IS DISCOLORED AND AVOID RUNNING HOT WATER.

MPW TELEPHONE SERVICE • BATTERY BACK-UP NOTICE

During a power outage, a backup power supply is required for you to make or receive calls with your MPW phone service. Without a battery backup, you will not be able to make any calls, including emergency calls to 911, while the power is out. If you choose to add a battery backup, only the optical network terminal (ONT) will be powered by the battery. Home security systems, wireless routers and other equipment will not run on an ONT backup battery. The exact battery backup duration will depend upon battery age, usage and environment. Please follow the instructions included with your battery for proper use, storage and care. Spring and summer storms are sure to come and MPW is always ready when weather threatens the reliability of your utility services. We now have new tools for detecting electrical and communications outages and can dispatch lineworkers and technicians more quickly. As reported previously, our interactive online electrical outage map, gives you a real-time look at the outages we know about, to save you a call. Please note that down or sparking wires or utility pole fires should be reported by phone or through the website form.

When a weather event happens, your MPW Customer Service Team joins members of System Control to manage customer inquiries and organize response and repairs. Around the clock, no matter what time 24/7/365, we respond. Restoring service as quickly and safely as possible is as important to us as it is to you. New Federal Internet Assistance Program

What is it? The Emergency Broadband Benefit Program (EBBP) is a temporary emergency federal government benefit program operated by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to assist customers in the purchase of Internet access. MPW is an authorized internet service provider (ISP) for the program.

Who can participate? A household is eligible if one member of the household has at least one of the following qualifications:

- Qualifies for the Lifeline program, including those who are on Medicaid or receive SNAP benefits.
- Receives benefits under the free and reduced school breakfast or lunch program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision, or did so in the 2019-2020 school year.
- Experienced a substantial loss of income since February 29, 2020, and the household had a total income in 2020 below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers.
- Received a federal Pell Grant in the current year

What are the benefits? The EBBP will provide a discount up to \$50 per month for broadband services for eligible consumers.


What else should I know? The Emergency Broadband Benefit is non-transferable and is limited to one discount per household.

Upon the program's conclusion, subscribers will be subject to regular rates, terms and conditions.

How do I sign up?

The program is expected to roll out at the end of April. The FCC and USAC have set up a website for information and applications. If unavailable at first, check back at:


